### LMC Veteran Relief Fund

The giving arm of the Last Man Club of Vietnam War Era of Saint Peter

The LMC Veteran Relief Fund is funded by the Last Man Club Golf Classic, grants from the DAV Foundation, VVA Chapter 999 and numerous other donations.

The Fund works with County Veteran Service Officers in a 6-county area and has been able to provide financial assistance (to date of 2-28-22) to 76 Veterans in need for a total of over \$60,000! The Fund has been able to assist Veterans ranging in age from their

early 20's to WWII Veterans in their 90's. The requests for assistance have ranged from \$45 up to the maximum of \$1,000. So far, the LMC has helped Veterans of the Air Force, Army, Marines and Navy. There has been a wide range of requests covering transportation, housing, mobility, PTSD evaluation, dental, medical and more.

The Relief Fund is something that you, as a Last Man Club member, should be VERY proud of! It is hands on 'Veterans Helping Veterans.'


Golf Classic The tournament relies on volunteers to raise money, sell hole sponsors and acquire donated items for the raffle

## HOW VIETNAM VETERANS DAY CAME TO BE

Starting in 2008 several states began observing March 29 significant to veterans; in 2011 the U.S. Senate requested Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day, and was moderately accepted; and March 29, 2012, President Barack Obama dropped the 'Welcome home' declaring the day dedicated as Vietnam Veterans Day, encouraging all of America to observe the contributions of the military members that served during the Vietnam War.

This was followed by the Coalition of States Council recommending a congressional proclamation in December of 2016. Senators Pat Tooney of PA and Joe Donnelly of IN authored the bill, Congress approved, and March 28, 2017, President Donald Trump signed the Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017, recognizing March 29 as perpetual National Vietnam War Veterans Day.
