After a Legion meeting ten years ago, Windy Block, Ron Haugen and John Jensen were joined by Jim Weber for a discussion about starting a Last Man Club for Vietnam Veterans. The intent was to be more of a social group that would honor and support fellow veterans and country.

An organizational meeting was held on Nov. 17, 2011 at the William R. Witty American Legion Post 37 to discuss Articles of Incorporation, By-laws, an annual banquet and other agenda items. The original membership goal was 30. Ten years later, this Last Man Club is now 353 members strong and still growing. The Club has not only grown in membership but also in ways it supports veterans and the community.

The Club was active in supporting the St. Peter Area Veterans Memorial, participates in promoting patriotism through parades and presentations at area schools, holds an annual golf classic to raise funds for local veterans in crisis, a long with a host of other activities.



Vietnam Veterans Day Ceremony

More than 200 community members gathered on March 29th at the St. Peter Area Veterans Memorial for a Vietnam Veterans Day Ceremony put on by the Last Man Club.


A bell was tolled for each fallen soldier followed up by the playing of Taps. A moment of silence was observed for all those lost in the war.

LMC Veteran Relief Fund

The helping arm of the Last Man Club

The LMC Veteran Relief Fund consists of proceeds generated by the annual Last Man Club Golf Classic and is designed to provide emergency assistance to local veterans as well as assist with unmet needs where no Federal, State or Local program exists or funds have been exhausted.



To date, the LMC Veteran Relief Fund has provided emergency and relief assistance to 58 LOCAL veterans experiencing a hardship ranging in age from 29 to 95 years old, across most conflict eras and branches of service, and totaling nearly \$42,000 in financial assistance. In the past 12 months, the fund has awarded \$16,440 in assistance. The relief fund serves Nicollet, Blue Earth, Le Sueur, Brown, Sibley and Waseca counties.

The Last Man Club is 353 members strong and growing! At the first annual banquet on June 16, 2012, the membership of the Club was 184. Eighty-two Vietnam era veterans and 3 WWII veterans attended the first banquet. We've lost 24 of our members to death since we organized in November of 2011. The membership continues to grow at a rate of about 9 members per year.

The VA's Million Veteran Program is a national research study done in conjunction with Veterans Affairs. MVP is a voluntary research program to help researchers understand how genes, lifestyle and military exposures affect the health and illness of veterans and humankind. Since launching in 2011, over 825,000 veteran partners have joined one of the world's largest programs on genetics and health. Veterans who partner with MVP contribute to improving the lives of fellow veterans by helping to understand issues such as: predicting the risk of cancer, the complications of diabetes, managing mental issues like PTSD and depression, and cardiovascular disease. Currently, there is an online COVID-19 survey available to participants to learn more about how the pandemic is affecting physical and mental health.
